Three Reasons God Says No

1. God <u>protects</u> us.

He knows about everyone, everywhere. Everything about us is bare and wide open to the all-seeing eyes of our living God; nothing can be hidden from him. (Hebrews 4:13, The Living Bible)

[God] guards the paths of the just and protects those who are faithful to him. (Proverbs 2:8, NLT)

2. God has a <u>better</u> plan for us.

All these people earned a good reputation because of their faith, yet none of them received all that God had promised. For God had something better in mind for us. (Hebrews 11:39 – 40, NLT)

3. God wants to give us something better.

These have come so that the proven genuineness of your faith—of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire—may result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed. (1 Peter 1:7, God's Word)

For our present troubles are small and won't last very long. Yet they produce for us a glory that vastly outweighs them and will last forever! What do I do when God says no?

1. Thank God when he answers.

2. Share your <u>pain</u> with God.

"Abba, Father," he cried out, "everything is possible for you. Please take this cup of suffering away from me. Yet I want your will to be done, not mine. (Mark 14:35-36, NLT)

You keep track of all my sorrows. You have collected all my tears in your bottle. You have recorded each one in your book.

(Psalm 56:8, NLT)

3. Pray for God's <u>strength</u> through difficult times.

Three different times I begged the Lord to take it away. Each time he said, "My grace is all you need. My power works best in weakness." So now I am glad to boast about my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ can work through me. That's why I take pleasure in my weaknesses, and in the insults, hardships, persecutions, and troubles that I suffer for Christ. For when I am weak, then I am strong. (2 Corinthians 12:8-10, NLT)
